ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

The MPA-HPAM program can be completed in two years fulltime or 3-4 years part-time, with the flexibility to switch between the two. All students take core courses to gain essential skills in management, policy, and finance. Students then focus on a specialization, each of which has a set of required courses and a wide range of electives.

SPECIALIZATIONS

Students must complete a total of 45 credits to graduate.

HEALTH FINANCE

Students in this specialization choose from two subspecialization areas:

Health Services Financial Management focuses on the basic skills required to organize and interpret financial information and **Healthcare Public Finance** provides the concepts and skills needed for careers that focus on the financial aspects of healthcare policy and the healthcare delivery system.
